The Society reserves the right to postpone or cancel the Show, or any particular section or event, if such cancellation, postponement arises out of strikes, lock-outs, trade disputes or labour problems, or any other cause beyond the control of the Society, including, but without limitation, Act of God, Governmental Act Regulation or request, fire, accident, war, riot or inability to obtain adequate labour, materials or sufficient number of entries.

The Schedule is issued subject to the Orders & Advice of DEFRA – The Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs, and any Local Authorities which may be operative at the time of the Show.

CONDITIONS FOR ALL LIGHT HORSE & PONY EXHIBITORS

Stabling

Temporary de-luxe stabling on the Showground may be reserved by Light Horse & Pony exhibitors at £35.00 per stable per night (all prices include VAT). See Entries Form. Stables will not be allocated to exhibitors for the storage of harness, etc.; in their own interests exhibitors should store all equipment, forage etc., securely in their traveling vehicles. Water and limited straw will be provided for all exhibitors. Stables will be allocated on a first-come first-served basis.

Certification of Health

Horses / Donkeys sent direct from other EU Member States must be accompanied by Certification of Health in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive for the species, including additional certification granted to the UK under Community provisions. It is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that the animals will be eligible to return to their Member State.

Times of Judging

Horses may arrive at any time before Judging of the Classes in which they are exhibiting in, and may leave any time after Judging of their Class has been completed, except those required to parade or compete for Championships or Specials (please see section for details)

Timetable

The times given in the Schedule are provisional. The Council reserves the right to cancel, add or amend any of the Classes and revise the Timetable as necessary. The final Timetable will be issued with the tickets 3 weeks prior to the Show.

Riding Hats

All riders of Horses & Ponies taking part in the Show must wear a hat to the current BSI Standards with safety harness correctly fitted and securely fastened. This applies to every person when mounted and will involve disqualification for those who do not comply. The only exception being in Classes 4, 170 & 172, when traditional headgear, i.e. silk or bowler hat, may be worn in the Judging Ring.

Conditions This Show is affiliated to Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain and Classes in this section will be judged in accordance with SHB (GB) Rules. All animals must be registered with the SHB (GB) and for qualifying Classes, registered in the 2009 Show Hunter Register. The Registration number must be quoted on the Entry Form and the owner and rider must be a member of the SHB (GB).
Entries in the Riding Horse Classes are not eligible for Classes 1-4, 7 & 8 and Ridden Hunters may not compete in the Classes for Riding Horse Under Saddle. Judges are empowered to transfer any exhibit in a Light or Middle Weight Class to a Heavy Weight Class, if they consider that the exhibit exceeds the specified weight.

Qualifiers Classes 1, 2, 3, 4 & 8 are Qualifying Events for the Royal International Horse Show 2009. The two highest placed horses in each Class will qualify to enter at RIHS. No horse lower than 2nd place will qualify.
This Show is also a Qualifier for the National Hunter Supreme Championship Show (NHSCS) in Sept 2009. Classes 1, 2, 3, 4 & 8 are qualifying events for this year's NHSCS and only horses registered on the current years Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter. The first three Horses to qualify, no horse lower than 3rd will qualify.
This Show is a Qualifier for the BLUE CHIP & IDHS (GB) £2,000 CHALLENGE. The qualifier will be the highest placed horse (not already qualified) from Classes 1-4 & 7-8 that is registered or eligible for registration on the Irish Draught or Irish Draught Sport Horse Register, i.e. with a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding. The Show's schedules are issued subject to the orders of DEFRA. The Society cannot accept any responsibility for any circumstances or costs, which may arise as a result of such orders and therefore, exhibitors & competitors, shall indemnify the Society against any actions, costs or interpretations arising out of such orders.

1. DISCLAIMER

- a. The Society will not be held responsible for any accident, injury, damage or loss however caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or handler, or to any animal, article, damage or property brought onto the Showground, whilst entering or leaving or being carried out, or in the said Showground.
- b. Each exhibitor is solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article, or property exhibited or brought on to the Showground themselves, and will indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of, or in respect of, any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.
- c. It is recommended that exhibitors insure against fire and other such liabilities as the exhibitor may incur under these Regulations.
- d. Exhibitors should undertake a risk assessment where relevant of their activities, which would be retained for use at all shows throughout the year.

2. MAKING AN ENTRY

- a. The person in whose name the animal is entered will be held responsible for abiding by the Rules & Regulations of this Show and indemnifying it against any claims for damage etc, which may arise.
- b. The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry or entries without assigning any reason.
- c. Every animal at the Show must be exhibited in the name of the person who entered it, and whose name will appear in the Catalogue. A ram, boar or bull hired out for a period will be considered to be the property of the person to whom it is hired by.
- d. Entry fees will not be refunded.
- e. All entries must be made on the Summary and full details of the animals entered on the coloured entry forms. As this information will appear in the catalogue, please fill it in carefully.
- f. No person will be entitled to a prize unless his stock has been duly entered and the proper fees and certificates submitted with entries.
- g. Horses, ponies and donkeys, two years of age and upwards, must be named before an entry is made. Any colt of two years of age and upwards must be granted a Breed Society Licence or a Licence issued by an equivalent body in a Member State, for Shetland, Dales, Exmoor and Highland ponies. This rule is extended to three years of age and over.
- h. If any deliberate misstatement is detected in any declaration or certificate, or the age of any animal should not agree with the certificate, the exhibitor may be disqualified.

3. JUDGING

- a. Exhibitors are not permitted to enter an animal in any class which is to be judged by a person who has bred or has a financial interest in the animal. The onus of complying with this regulation rests entirely on the exhibitor. However, if through unforeseen circumstance, a Judge finds before him/her an animal which he/she has bred or owned, he/she shall place all other animals in the class, and shall then call in a referee judge to place the particular animal in question.
- b. A person may not Steward and also exhibit in the same section, nor act as a Steward in a section in which a close relative is also exhibiting.

- c. At the Judge's discretion, a number of horses may be asked to give an individual show in any class and the judge may ride a number of horses.

4. BREED SOCIETIES

- a. All animals must have competed in their respective Breed classes to be eligible to compete for Special and Championship prizes.
- b. For all persons entering, competing or exhibiting an animal in a class covered by a Breed Society, to which this Society is affiliated, the Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed Society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including any disciplinary procedures) insofar as they are applicable to any event, competition or display promoted or arranged by this Society.

5. ARMBANDS

- a. Exhibitors in In-hand classes are requested to wear an armband. All exhibitors must provide their own armbands to be eligible to compete in special classes.

6. HEIGHTS OF HORSES & PONIES

- a. Joint Measurement Boards Certificates should be available for checking that an animal is within the height limit for its class. In all other cases where there is a height restriction, animals may be measured by one of the Veterinary Surgeons during judging

7. CLASSES

- a. Any class with less than four entries may be cancelled.
- b. Entries must be from two or more individual exhibitors in each class for the class to be held.
- c. Special classes are noted in the schedule as 'S'. This class will not be charged with an entry fee, unless specified in the schedule.

8. TICKET ALLOCATION

- a. Exhibitors will be issued with one vehicle pass. Please see below a list of ticket allocations for exhibitors, depending on amount of animals entered:

Number of animals entered	3 or 4	Handlers/stockperson passes	2
Number of animals entered	5 or 6	Handlers/stockperson passes	3

- b. This is the maximum free allocation to each exhibitor.

9. HEALTH DECLARATION/MOVEMENT PERMITS

- a. To meet the requirements of various Legislation and Authorities, Show Organisers are responsible for being able to identify, and also for the good health and welfare of Livestock entering the Showground. Therefore, all exhibitors are reminded that it will be necessary for them to complete and hand in on arrival at the Showground, a Health Declaration Form, which will be supplied with the Exhibitor tickets. This form incorporates a movement permit, certifying that since the time of entry, to the best of their knowledge, their Livestock is disease free and has not mixed with any other stock known to be suffering from any type of notifiable disease or infection and that such Livestock has been vaccinated as required.

10. SUBSTITUTION

- a. Substitute entries cannot be allowed except in 'exceptional circumstances'.

- b. The Council reserves the right to substitute other Judges for those announced in the Schedule or Catalogues.
- c. All entries are accepted on this understanding and there can be no refund of entry fees where substitutions are made.

11. TIMES

- a. Commercial Beef Cattle must be in the Stock Lines by 2pm on Friday, 9th May for weighing which will be held between 2pm & 5pm. Stock for weighing will only be accepted between these times, no weighing will take place after these hours.
- b. Sheep, Pigs, Angora Goats and Cattle must be in the Stock Lines before 7am on the Saturday morning of the Show, (with the exception of calves in Class 687, which may be brought in on Sunday morning and for which no accommodation will be provided).

12. HEALTH & SAFETY

- a. All exhibitors and their handlers must comply with the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974.
- b. Exhibitors are asked to use the Livestock Walks/Routes whilst leading animals, from pens/stalls to the Judging Ring.

13. PARADE

- a. All animals must remain on the Showground, with exception of pigs, until after the Grand Parade on Sunday afternoon.
- b. All prize-winning animals and first and second prize winners must parade as directed, or forfeit the prize-money.

14. REMOVAL OF ANIMALS

- a. Livestock may only be removed from the Showground during the Show on the production of a Vet's certificate, which will be issued by one of the Show's Veterinary Surgeons.
- b. Horses, ponies and donkeys may arrive at any time before the classes commence and may leave at any time after judging, with the exception of the Championships or Specials.

15. BANNED SUBSTANCES

- a. The Society strongly disapproves of the administration of tranquillizers or any other form of drug to Show exhibits, whether entered for competition or demonstration, which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question, or have the effect of making it behave in the Show Ring, or elsewhere on the Society's property, in a manner which is not natural. Any exhibitor (or his representative), who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such tranquillizer or drug to any Show exhibit, will be reported to the Council of the Newark & Nottinghamshire Agricultural Society, to be dealt with at its discretion, and additionally, the matter will be reported to the appropriate Breed Society or organization and will render the exhibitor liable to disqualification.
- b. The Society reserves the right to insist upon a drugs test, carried out by one of the Society's Veterinary Officers, on any animal involved in any form of accident.

16. DISEASE PREVENTION

- a. The Society's Veterinary Officers are authorized to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to, or to have removed from the Showground, or moved into the isolation area, any animal suspected of being infected with a contagious or infectious disease, or a disease that renders the animal unfit or unsafe to exhibit. Such an animal will not be allowed to compete.
- b. Each exhibitor shall indemnify the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims made by any person, company or representative body of whatsoever nature in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly connected with bringing onto the Society's Showground any animal which may have been, or is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or which develops into such a disease whilst on the Showground. The exhibitor will pay all costs and expenses incurred by the Society in connection with any such claim.

- c. Exhibitors are especially cautioned not to send animals to the Show, which are suffering from ringworm at any stage, or from any eruptive skin disease. Any animal found to be affected by any kind of disease will have to be confirmed by the Veterinary Surgeons. If confirmed, the animal will be disqualified from competing and will be removed from the Showground.
- d. Cattle should be vaccinated against Lepto Hardvo.
- e. Exhibitors are reminded that the Society will accept no responsibility for animals which contract the disease as a result of exhibiting at this Show.
- f. The Society reserves the right to recover the full cost of veterinary services and for any drugs used in the treatment of an animal whilst on the Showground.
- g. It is a condition of entry that the Veterinary Surgeons may, on their own authority, give emergency treatment to any animal as they consider appropriate, in the event that the owner or handler cannot be immediately found.

17. HANDLING OF ANIMALS

- a. All animals must be halter led.
- b. Stewards can dismiss any exhibitor from the Judging Ring or Weighing Scales if the animal is not under proper control.
- c. It is imperative that exhibitors and their handlers, whilst leading their animals (pigs must be handled with pig boards) are aware of their obligations to the safety of the general public at all times during the Show. The instructions of the Stewards must be obeyed, particularly at the crossover points and junctions.
- d. Exhibitors must only lead one animal at any one time.

18. DRESS & CONDUCT

- a. Stock attendants in the sheep, pig, Angora goat & cattle sections must wear white coats, with the exception of the Holstein section, who will dress in accordance with the Holstein Society Rules.
- b. All exhibitors, grooms & handlers attending horses in the judging rings must be properly dressed and must wear hats.
- c. All riders must wear a hat to the current BSI standards, with safety harness fitted and securely fastened. This applies to every rider when mounted and the exhibitor will be disqualified for those who do not comply. The only exception to this rule are in classes 4, 170 & 174, when traditional headgear, i.e. bowler hat, may be worn in the judging ring only.
- d. No animal is allowed to display any advertising material, whilst in the Judging Ring, which may indicate the owner or breeder of the animal, i.e. jackets, clothes or rugs.
- e. An exhibitor or his handler, having once entered the judging ring with his exhibit, may not leave the ring with his exhibit before completion of judging of that class, except by permission of the Judge or Steward. Any exhibitor or his handler, who leaves the ring without permission, will be disqualified from competing.
- f. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behavior of their handlers and for the consequences of any misconduct of such handlers. An exhibitor or his handler who is responsible for an infringement of the regulations or misconduct, or any exhibitor or member of the general public who conducts himself in an improper or offensive manner, to any Judge, Member of Council, Steward or Official appointed by the Society, will be reported to the Chief Executive. He/she may be refused entry to the Showground, and may not be allowed to compete in any class or competition that he/she may have entered.

19. ACCOMMODATION

- a. Animals entered in any class at this Show must remain within the designated area of the Showground and remain in the accommodation where this is provided by the Show. Excepting as required for by the Show, animals must not be removed to any trade stand or exhibition, for any purpose whatsoever. Any animal moved will be disqualified and any prize-money or prizes won will be forfeited.

- c. Accommodation for sheep and pigs will be provided in the John Crocker Halls, and for cattle in the Sir John Eastwood Building. Council reserves the right to make alternative arrangements if the necessity arises.
- d. Water & limited straw will be provided.
- e. Exhibitors must make their own arrangements for feeding stuffs.
- f. During the time that the Show is open to the public, no sheeting or any other material should be affixed to any pen or stall, in such a way that any animal is concealed from public view.
- g. The charges for stables are shown in the Schedule. These must be booked and paid for at the time of entry.
- h. Entry fees plus half the charge of stables will be refunded to exhibitors wishing to cancel their entry, only at the discretion of the Society.

20. TIMETABLE

- a. The times of judging given in the Schedule are provisional.
- b. The Council reserves the right to cancel, add to or amend any class which is published in the Schedule, or any times advertised in the provisional timetable.
- c. The final timetable will be sent out with exhibitor tickets.
- d. Every endeavor will be made to facilitate an exhibitor showing the same animal in two or more classes. The Society cannot be held responsible in the event of two classes clashing.

21. PROTEST

- a. Any exhibitor at the Show feeling himself aggrieved must make his protest in writing, within one hour of the completion of the judging of the class to which it refers, and a deposit of £10 is to be paid to the Main Show Office. Objections will not be entertained from any person or organization not exhibiting in the same class as the animal to which the objection is raised. The Appeals Committee will consider objections (excepting those handled by other appropriate organizations) at a time and place to be fixed by them and the person making the objection must be available to attend, or be represented by his authorized agent at the appointed time and place. The decision of the Appeals Committee shall be final and if the protest is not substantiated, the deposit may be forfeited. The animal, to which the objection is raised, must remain on the Showground until permission to leave has been obtained from the Show office in writing. The Society reserves to itself the right to refer an objection to any authority or organization to adjudicate, wholly or in part, in respect of an objection, on behalf of the Society.
- b. The owner or person in charge of any animal exhibited, refusing to obey the instructions of the Stewards, or removing his stock before the authorized time, will be expelled from the Showground, and the animals removed forthwith, and will forfeit any prize/s that may have been awarded to any animal in his charge. The Council shall have the power to refuse entries from such an exhibitor at any future Show.

22. PRIZE-MONEY

- a. All prize-money will be paid and dispatched to the person in whose name the exhibit is entered and shown in the Catalogue as the Exhibitor/Owner.
- b. Prize-money will be paid out within one month after the Show.
- c. Judges are empowered to withhold prizes if they are of the opinion that sufficient merit has not been shown.

23. TROPHIES

- a. Cups and Trophies may be collected from the Awards Office on the day of the Show. Exhibitors are requested to return the cup or trophies in good condition at their own expense, when requested to do so.
- b. Exhibitors are forbidden to have any cup or trophy engraved. Any exhibitor who ignores this ruling will be charged a substantial sum to cover the cost of restitution.
- c. The Society reserves the right to prevent any cup or trophy from leaving the Society's premises.
- d. Prize winners must insure their cup or trophy while in their possession.

24. GENERAL

a. **Rosettes**

No animal shall be decorated with any rosettes or ribbons other than those for the current year and other rosettes awarded at the current Show.

b. **Photographs**

The taking of photographs for sale is forbidden, except by those persons given permission by the Chief Executive or Show Manager. Any person found contravening this rule will be asked to leave the Showground.

c. **Smoking**

Smoking is forbidden in the Cattle Lines, Judging Rings and stable area, particularly where there is fodder, straw etc stored. All these areas will be defined by the '**NO SMOKING**' signs.
